



Packet Station Status by Cory N1URA

The callsign for the United Valley Red Cross has changed because packet mailboxes should conform to having -1. Since W1NPP-1 is already in use by the Androscoggin EMA a different callsign had to be used. I wanted to use a tactical callsign UVRC, however, the Brunswick node (KS1R-1) does not recognize this type of callsign. Instead, the callsign W1MFJ is being used for the United Valley Red Cross and W1MFJ-1 will serve as its mailbox. The packet station at the Mid Coast Red Cross building in Topsham now has their packet station running and their mailbox is now set up as N1TRC-1. Packet activity has increased quite a bit in the past few months and hopefully this trend will continue.
