

# Androscoggin County RACES/ARES by Ivan Lazure N1OXA

The RACES/ARES Meeting was held on April 10<sup>th</sup> 2007 at the Androscoggin EMA Office in Lewiston. In attendance was AA1UT, N1OXA, KB1CDU, KB1DOI, N1WFO, WE1U, N1MDL

No meeting in May; instead we will have a communications drill on Tuesday May 8<sup>th</sup> 2007 at 1830 EDT on 146.61 (no pl tone) to test coverage for Livermore Falls, Leeds, Greene, Lewiston, Auburn, and Durham. Livermore will require a cross band repeater. The Communication Truck will be used at Greene. There are plans afoot for joint drills with other ARES groups during the coming year.

The Truck has a Yaesu FT-897 all-mode for HF, 6m, 2m and 70cm with a Yaesu FC-40 tuner. Kenwood TM-D700A 2m/70cm FM-only Dual-Band. To be setup and/or check out are the G5RV antenna and the APRS/Packet Setup W1NPP-5. The EMA Office has only a Alinco 2m FM transceiver which is usually set up for a packet bbs on 145.01 W1NPP-1. The Packet station is swaped out for 2m voice operations (There is a mike for the radio.) There is a 75m dipole on the roof that need attention. The HF radio for the EMA office has been cut from the budget repeatedly.

Red Cross is moving to 1180 Lisbon Street sometime in May. The Antennas need to be removed from the East St location and moved to the new location. Setup Park Ave. School(EMA Shelter)

We are also starting a monthly ARES Net on the 146.61 repeater, the first one was on March 27, 2007 at 1830 EDT the next two will be April 24<sup>th</sup> and May 22<sup>nd</sup> 2007. CERT Training needs 15-20 people to be a go. Send out ARES Application form with May ACORN. EMA Web Site is being moved
