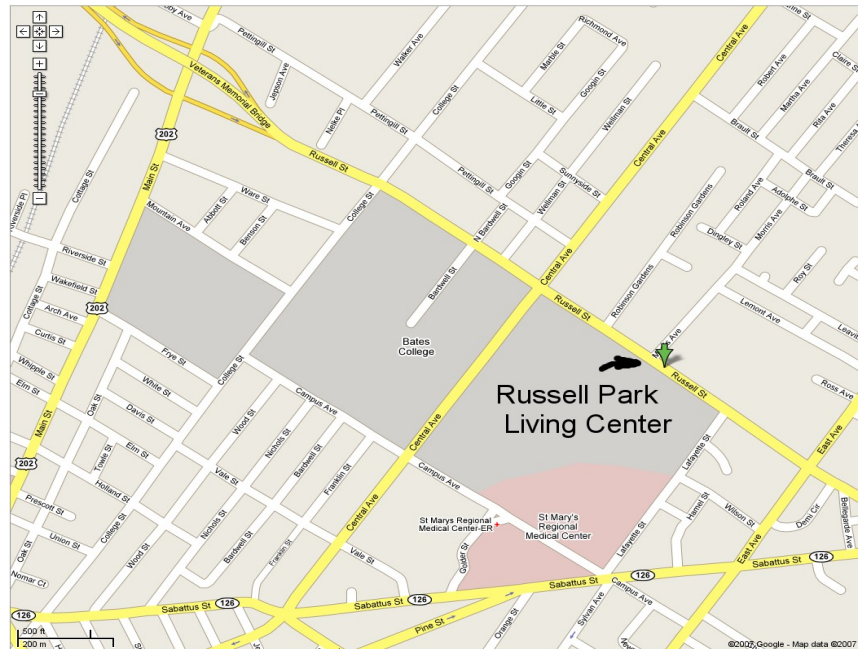

Secretary's Report - Dick N1NYW

The Androscoggin Amateur Radio Club held its' monthly meeting Wednesday May 6, 2009 at Russell Park in Lewiston. In attendance: n1llu, n1jd, n1oxa, kb1rsd, n1nyw, n1wfo, kb1hfy, kb1doi, n1kat, w1scm and son Charles, n1lura, w1lyzd, w1oks, w1eoj, w1how, n1svb, k1wtx, n1dot.

The ARES meeting was called to order at 6:43 PM by Cory n1lura. A fox hunt was discussed at Thorncraig but it was decided to put that off until after the black flies and other bugs have been fed properly and would not have to use us for lunch, maybe in the fall. Cory suggests doing a drill at least once per quarter and at least one drill during the week to see how many hams would be available at that time.

Cory would like to use "prosigns" during the drills or events. He explained the use of the prosigns over, roger-wilco, out and wait.

The ARES meeting was adjourned at 6:59 PM.

After a brief snack time the Androscoggin Club meeting was called to order by President Bill Woodhead at 7:02 PM. Earle n1svb moved to accept the Secretary's report as printed in the ACORN. Andy kb1doi seconded the motion. Vote: approved. Ivan n1oxa gave the Treasurers report. Andy kb1doi moved to accept the report and the motion was seconded by Jim wb1hfy. Vote: approved. Ivan reported on the scholarship fund and reports that it earns 1.5% interest. No one applied for the scholarship so the money will earn more interest until next year.

Ivan reported that nine hams did communications for the MS Walk last month and there was less than four hundred walkers and no major injuries just some tired feet. Dick n1nyw reported that the United Ambulance golf cart units batteries ran down before the walk was over because they forgot to charge it the night before.

Ivan reports that the permission has been granted to use the Park Avenue Elementary school in Auburn for field day again this year. There was discussion about which call sign to use at field day this year. It was suggested that other call signs would be better for certain modes. After some discussion it was decided to continue using the club call w1npp.

Cory says the antenna work is progressing and also suggests that we get a practice session in before field day to use the logging software before the event.

Bill brought up the subject of food at field day, burgers and hot dogs?

Ivan says that many events are coming up, Beach to Beacon, Pottle Hill, Trek Across Maine. Plenty of chances to operate at public service events. Ivan says that Brian k1aam is operating a repeater on 147.315 MHz in Poland that has pretty good coverage. Brian has a \$120 per year electric bill for the repeater and is looking for donations to help with the cost.

The purchase of a APRS tracking unit to be used on events was discussed. It is a combination GPS, radio and battery pack for AA batteries and it is in a waterproof case. Rick n1wfo reported that it is cheaper to buy this unit than all the items separate. Howie w1how moved to spend the \$250 for the tracker, Jim wb1hfy seconded the motion. Vote: Approved.

Jim wb1hfy moved to adjourn and Jerry k1wtx seconded the motion. Vote: approved at 7:50 PM.



DX News - Earle N1SVB

The past month we made 46 DX contacts representing 28 different countries. The antenna is still pointed south and will most likely stay that way until we can investigate the rotor and cable further to determine what the problem is. Countries worked in April were:

We gave a couple of calls and much to our surprise he came back to us.
