Androscoggin County RACES/ARES by Tim Bubier-AA1UT

- 1. Updated info. on the upcoming exercise in Oxford County We have a planning meeting next Thurs. (6/21) to discuss our role in the exercise. The scenario will be a Hazmat/WMD event taking place at or near the intersection of Routes 4 & 108 in Livermore/Canton. The dates are:Tabletop 20 Oct 07; Functional 03 May 08; Full Scale 18 Oct. 08. This gives us plenty of time to prepare. We will be participating along with the Oxford ARES group and I will have more details about that after next Thur's meeting.
- 2. The Mobile Command Truck will be stationed at the Balloon Festival after all. Auburn PD has requested its presence as a command post to run the event 16-20 August. With that, we should be able to offer our services (more on the radio club side of things) to the balloonists who might wish to place an APRS transmitter in their basket. We obviously can't interfere with emergency services' use of the truck but we would be fairly unobtrusive. Bill, N1KAT, and I will meet later this week to discuss this further and to start planning. This would be an excellent exercise for us using the equipment and to bring our services to the attention of the public, the balloonists and the PDs. I had APRS up and running June 12th 2007 for a demonstration with public safety officials and everyone was quite impressed. http://www.sunjournal.com/soundshows/2007/CITaubnims0613/
- 3. I announced that Ivan has asked to step down as RACES coordinator. I have not spoken with him since he emailed that request and suggested that Cory would be willing to take up that post. The consensus was that Cory would be a good replacement. The only negative comment was that Cory's changing work schedule might mean that he was not always available for our meetings. My feeling was that, at least from what I currently know of his schedule, this would not pose any big dilemma. The position is an appointment and I have offered it to Cory if he was willing. Cory has since accepted the position and added that his schedule will again be changing. He is going to a 10 hr. workday with a three-on, three-off schedule that will actually make him available more often. **His nomination has been approved.**
- 4. I would like to schedule one of our next eyeball meetings (maybe even next month's) as a work session out in Greene with the command truck. This would be to familiarize the members with the radio equipment on board and to finish the installation of some of the ham features such as a mounting bracket for the G5RV, the antenna selection switch so we don't need to keep swapping coax and the mounting of the random-wire antenna tuner. We all need to practice using the equipment because even I can't remember simple things like changing bands on the HT or setting the offsets on the '897 if I don't do it more often. We talked about making cheat-sheets and having them laminated to post at the operating positions. We also need to reprogram the Kenwood to put repeater updates into memory and add them to the Yaesu. I left it that Cory would contact the members if we were going to have the next meeting in Greene. After speaking to him, I think that it is likely that we will do the July meeting in Greene. I just need to check with the fire chief to see if this would interfer with anything they have scheduled.

On hand for our meeting were: N1JD, N1MDL, KB1DOI, KB1CDU and AA1UT. We adjourned at about 1840 hrs.

Cory wrote to me to inquire about moving the packet station. The whole reason we have it here is to send and receive info at the EOC during an emergency. If we move it we lose both the packet and 2 meter capabilities here leaving us with no ham connection at all. Although I wish the node were more accessible, I think we should be looking at placing another node somewhere in a better position especially since it would improve accessibility this one. Any ideas???

Andy Club Minutes by Dick Knight N1NYW

The Androscoggin Amateur Radio Club held a meeting Wednesday June 6, 2007 at Russell Park in Lewiston Maine. In attendance: n1llu, kb1cdu, kb5sud, n1dot, kb1iec, n1mdl, aa4ar, n1jd, n1avj, kb1ieg, kb1gvt, wb1hfy, wa1eoj, w1scm and son Charles, kb1doi, n1nyv, kb1nhd, we1u, n1svb, n1oxa, and n1nyw.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Vice President Earle Gilmore. Brian n1mdl moved to accept the Secretarys' report as printed in the ACORN, Bob kb5sud seconded the motion. Vote: approved.

Ivan did not have a Treasurers report because the statement was still at Bills. Harold n1llu moved to postpone the report until the next meeting, and Andy kb1doi seconded. Vote: approved.

Andy kb1doi moved to cancel next months meeting because it would fall on the July 4th holiday, Bob kb5sud seconded the motion. Vote: approved.

Ivan brought up the subject of the already approved transfer of \$1000 from the checking account to the scholarship fund. The transfer has not taken place yet. Instead, because the Andy club sponsors the state convention every year and it made a profit this year, Ivan proposed to help other ARRL affiliated clubs with limited funds with half the cost of buying a set of ham radio books to donate to a library in their area. It would be a kind of pay back for the members of other clubs for their support of the convention. The MARA club in Brunswick already voted \$100 to match the anticipated \$100 from the Androscoggin club according to Steve aa4ak. Those books would be donated to Brunswick High School library so students involved with the newly formed ham radio club at the school will have the latest materials to use.

David we'lu moved to cancel the \$1000 transfer to the scholarship fund and Brian n1mdl seconded the motion. Vote: approved.

David we'lu then made a motion to spend \$100 to match the MARA club funds to buy books and approve up to \$900, the rest of the \$1000, to match nine other ARRL affiliated clubs who plan to buy and donate a set of books to a library in the coming year. The motion was seconded by Harold n'Illu. Vote: approved.

Ivan discussed the May 8th communications test and reminded the membership that the next RACES meeting is July 12th at 6 PM at the EMA office at the central fire station in Lewiston. He also told of planned exercises in the coming months.

The club packet station is at the EMA office and is now on the frequency 145.010. Other area frequencies were discussed.

Ivan sent the sign up sheet around the room and had members sign up for duties at field day. Field Day will be held on June 23rd and 24th with set up starting at 10 AM at the Auburn Mall. This year set up will be in the corner of the lot near the spot we have used for years. Operating will begin at 2 PM Saturday. Every ham or non ham is invited. The club is paying for a BBQ Saturday night. Besides the usual voice modes APRS, SSTV, Packet and PSK31 stations are planned.

Brian n1mdl moved to adjourn and Andy kb1doi seconded the motion. Vote: approved at 8:15 PM to watch a presentation by MARA club member Steve aa4ar about the special event and special event station planned for the 400th anniversary of the Popham Colony. The celebration and special event station will be at Medowbrook Campground August 17th to 19th Hams are invited to come and operate!
