

# **Knotty Thoughts David WE1U**

The **Klemheist Knot**, like the **Prusik Knot** discussed in the January 2009 ACORN, is sliding hitch or friction hitch, that can be used in pairs to ascend rope, or pole.

The Klemheist Knot grips under load and can be adjust along the rope or pole when the load remove, by lifting free end of the knot up. The Prusik Knot's free end must be held where it emerges from the knot to adjust it. Thus the Prusik Knot can grip the load in either direction, but the Klemheist is easier to adjust.

The Klemheist and Prusik Knots both start with a section of cord or rope with the end tied together with a Double Fisherman's or similar knot to form a **Prusik Loop**.

The Klemheist Knot is made by wrapping the loop around the rope or pole two or three times. More loops can be used to increase the friction for heavy loads. DO NOT Grip the KNOT – A RAPID Descent will occur.


#### Solder for Electronics David WE1U

Solder wire is made of metal alloys with melting points below 800°F. Brazing uses alloys above 800°F. The solder wire also has a core or cores with flux. The flux improves wetting, the flow of the molten alloy and reduces the formation of oxides.

Flux for electronic work usually is non-activated, "R." Mildly activated (RMA) is best cleaned off due to the corrosive mix and activated (RA) formulations corrode so it must be clean off. Plumber's solder is acid core and should not be used on circuits.

Various solders are available to assemble electronic projects. 60%Tin/40% Lead has been the most common solder. 63%Tin/37%Lead alloy melts and freezes at the same temperature unlike the 60/40 mix that passes through a "plastic state" after melting before freezing again. Moving a connection during the plastic stage forms a dull brittle joint. A good joint is smooth, shiny and adheres strongly.

Lead free alloys, using copper, silver, bismuth, indium, zinc and other less common other metal are being used due to d Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive (RoHS)
