

#### 2008 Simulated Emergency Test Cory-N1URA

Thank you to all who participated in the Simulated Emergency Test. I think that we did considerably well given the amount of check ins and amount of traffic that was passed in a relatively short period of time. I was glad to see the many modes and bands that were utilized during this drill; For HF, the Pine Tree Net, a CW National Traffic System net, was established on 3596 kHz, The Maine Emergency Communications Net was established on 3940 kHz and contact was made between stations on the daytime HF frequency of 7262 kHz. Repeaters on 6 meters, 2 meters, 1.25 meters (222 MHz) and 70 centimeters (440 MHz) were used. For digital communications, messages were sent via APRS and Packet. While the United Valley Red Cross experienced problems with their packet station, N1ZRL was able to relay traffic to the Topsham Red Cross via Packet. I sent and received APRS messages to and from Central Maine Medical Center (W1NPP-10, Gray Weather Service (WX1GYX) and Oxford ARES (W1OCA-1). I found the exercise a success since we were able to pass traffic through various means in a communication failure, exercised emergency power in the event of power outages, were able to serve multiple agencies and delegate authority within a structured net.
